The HAAC Juneteenth celebration has been growing steadily since its inception and past celebrations have been well attended.

As a vendor, you would participate in our event by selling your products (non-food), or advertising your services to our community. Products that promote hate of any kind or incite violence are prohibited. Any display of or attempt to sell such products will result in the termination of your vendor contract, forfeiture of the vendor fee, and you will be removed from the event.

VENDOR INFORMATION

In honor of our 10th year **THERE ARE NO VENDOR FEES!** However, you must still register, and your application MUST BE APPROVED to participate in the event.

- 1. The celebration begins at 3:00 p.m. Vendors can begin to set up at 1:00 p.m., and that your set up is completed by 2:30. The street will be blocked to vehicle traffic at 2:00 p.m. NO EXCEPTIONS. Please remain open until the end of the event.
- 2. Vendors will be located outside on the Clinton Street corridor or HAAC Way.
- 3. Vendors must BRING THEIR OWN TABLE and CHAIRS. A CANOPY/TENT is highly recommended.
