Haverstraw African American Connection (HAAC) would like to extend an invitation to join us at our 9th Annual Juneteenth Celebration on Saturday, June 15, 2024. There will be live entertainment, speakers, KIDZONE, food and various activities throughout the day. The HAAC Juneteenth celebration has been growing steadily since its inception and past celebrations have been well attended. This year we will be unveiling a permanent statue of Harriet Tubman, and a 32 ft. mural. The new additions to the park are expected to draw additional visitors.

As a vendor, you would participate in our event by selling your products (non-food), or advertising your services to our community. Products that promote hate of any kind or incite violence are prohibited. Any display of or attempt to sell such products will result in the termination of your vendor contract, forfeiture of the vendor fee, and you will be removed from the event.

- 1. Vendor fees are as follows:
 - \$ 0.00 Non-profit / Service organizations.
 - \$ 75.00 Vendors selling goods or services.
- 2. The celebration begins at 3:00 p.m. We ask that vendors are set up by 2:30 p.m. (the street will be blocked to vehicle traffic at 2:00 p.m.- NO EXCEPTIONS). Please remain open until the end of the event.
- 3. Vendors will be located outside on the Clinton Street corridor or HAAC Way.
- 4. Vendors must BRING THEIR OWN TABLE and CHAIRS. A CANOPY/TENT is highly recommended.

Registration closes on Monday June 10, 2024. Your space will not be reserved until the registration form and fee have been processed.
